Highlights

- The first Survivor Relief Centre was opened by the Ukrainian Government with UNFPA support in Zaporizhzhia, where survivors of conflict-related sexual violence can access a wide range of support services.
- Five new mobile psychosocial support teams have been deployed, bringing the total to 30, adding capacity to prevent and respond to gender-based violence (GBV) in war-affected communities of Ukraine's Sumy, Chernihiv and Kyiv regions.
- Over 1,800 refugee women, youth and older people received counseling and referrals to specialized services at UNFPA Orange Safe Spaces and from mobile teams in Moldova.



 Some 100,000 flyers were distributed among refugees in Romania to alert them of the risks of human trafficking and gender-based violence, as part of a joint project with the International Planned Parenthood Federation European Network (IPPF-EN) to support national efforts to ensure women and young people have access to SRH and GBV-related information and services.

Situation Overview/ Humanitarian Needs

- The war in Ukraine <u>continued</u> to shatter the lives of millions of people across the country as fighting escalated in the east. Damage to civilian infrastructure is impacting people's access to essential services, particularly water, electricity and health services in the Donbas region. Some 6.27 million people remain internally displaced, and over 5.6 millions refugees are <u>recorded</u> in European countries.
- As of 6 July, <u>WHO</u> had verified **308 attacks on health facilities**, and **access to health care** remains challenging due to severe service disruptions and additional patient workload in western regions.

UNFPA Humanitarian Response*

- The UNFPA-supported **national hotline in Ukraine for survivors of gender-based violence** operated by LaStrada received about 3,000 calls, about a third of them related to cases of gender-based violence.
- UNFPA-supported **safe spaces** continue to provide services and supplies to address gender-based violence, including conflict-related sexual violence. 7,000 dignity kits and other supplies were delivered to such facilities in Dnipro, Kryvyi Rih, Zaporizhzhia, Poltava, Vinnytsia, Mykolaiv and Lviv.
- Through three UNFPA-supported **mobile health clinics** operating in Kyiv, Vinnitsya and Lviv nearly 1,300 women received sexual and reproductive health services and referrals to specialized medical services.
- **Sexual and reproductive health kits** with instruments, drugs and other supplies for over 250 caesarian sections were distributed to three main perinatal centers in Moldova.
- **Post-rape treatment kits** were supplied to 41 medical institutions, and on-the-job training on the clinical management of rape cases was provided for medical personnel across Moldova.
- Over 80 doctors and nurses were **trained on the clinical management of rape** with a focus on gender-based violence, mental health and psychosocial support.
- **Orange Safe Spaces** were opened in the Brest and Gomal regions of Belarus, in collaboration with the Belarus Red Cross, to provide counseling and referrals to specialized services.
- Personnel of the Belarus Red Cross was **trained on providing gender-sensitive services** and prevention of gender-based violence in humanitarian crises.
- UNFPA is partnering in Romania with <u>IPPF-EN</u> and with the Center for Reproductive Rights in Hungary, Poland, Romania and Slovakia in providing sexual and reproductive healthcare information and support to women, girls and marginalized people fleeing the war in Ukraine.
